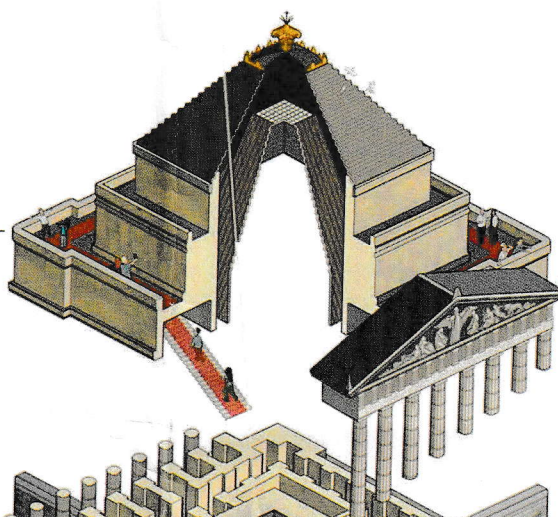


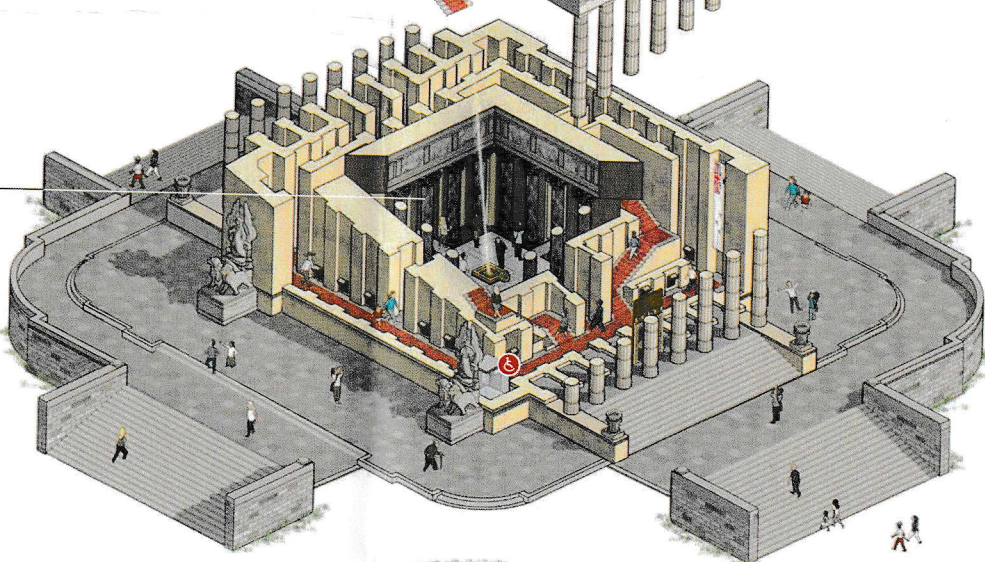
BALCONY

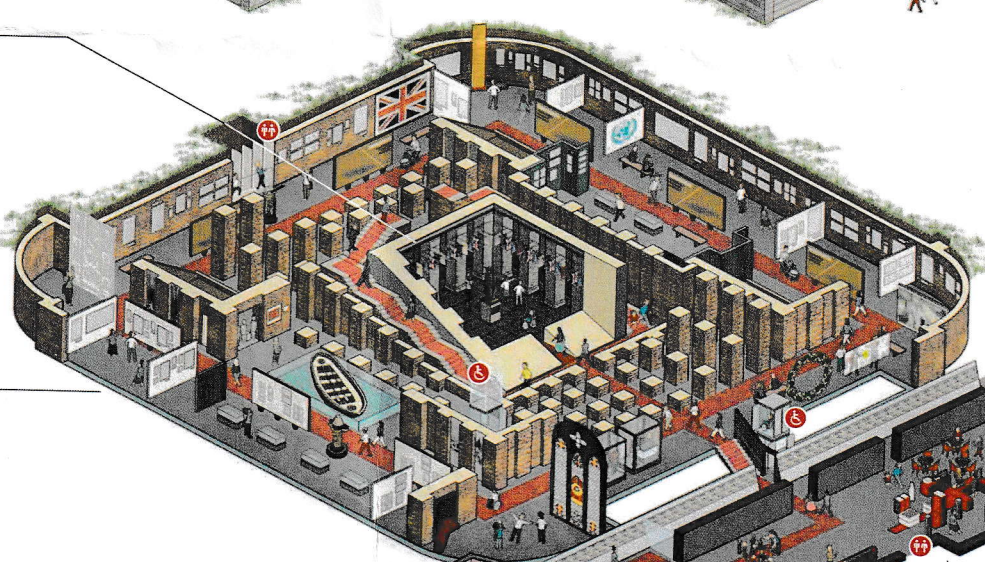
SANCTUARY

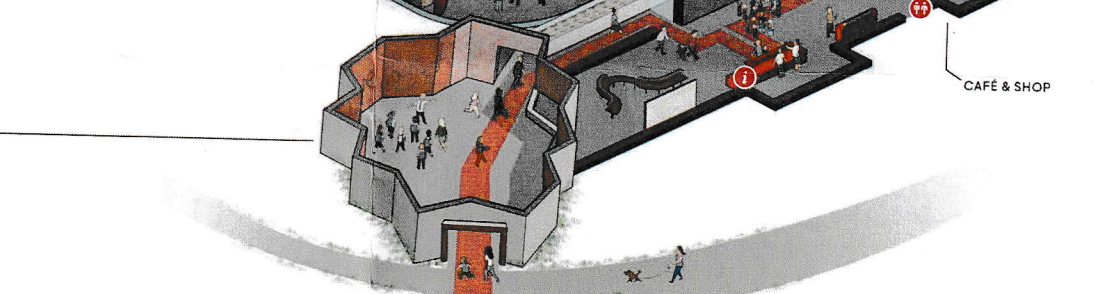
CRYPT

Commemorating the fighting units of the First World War, the Crypt features the unit colour patches and the names of ships lost in war; and the compelling Father and Son statue.



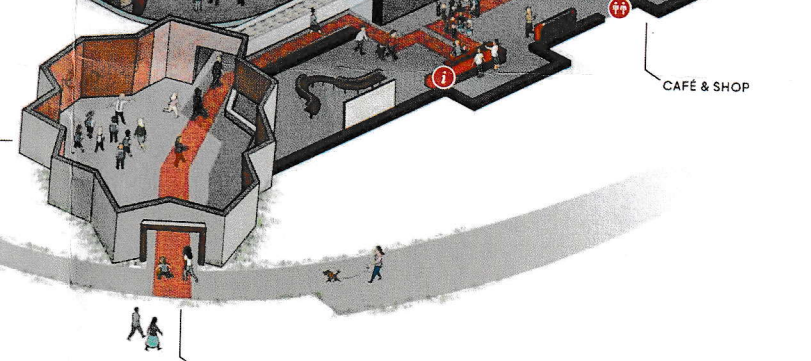
GALLERIES OF REMEMBRANCE
